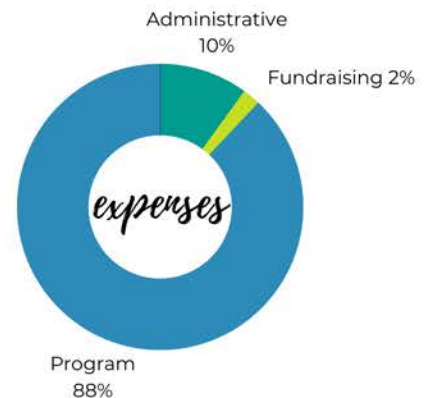

Curt Gordon Memorial Foundation

CHAD stakeholders are committed to growing the Curt Gordon Memorial Foundation, which fosters the innovation and outreach of our member agencies. This is a separate distribution of funds in addition to the annual campaign dollars. Seven agencies received grants from the Foundation this year. These grants provide vital funds for newly created or expanded programs across the state, resulting in more resources for Nebraskans.



Nebraska AIDS Project: Updated and expanded pantry operations and inventory in Lincoln and Kearney to improve client health with access to nutrition and increased case manager communications.



JDRF Nebraska-Iowa Chapter: Connected T1D patients and families for movie events in Grand Island, Kearney and Norfolk.



Nebraska Hospice and Palliative Care Association: Provided training for hospice nurse certification for 30 participants.



Arthritis Foundation Nebraska: Supported a juvenile arthritis program, enabling 15 more families to connect with the juvenile arthritis community through a Family Day event.



Nebraska Health Care Foundation: Provided behavioral health training for nursing home and assisted living staff, which was simultaneously simulcast in Lincoln, Kearney and Scottsbluff.



Brain Injury Alliance of Nebraska: Expanded access to in-person programming in rural Nebraska with five Resource Facilitators across the state.



United Cerebral Palsy of Nebraska: Increased access to Therapeutic Listening in five Tech Tool Development Technology libraries in Kearney, Grand Island and Lincoln.

Agency Resources

CHAD member agencies support health and wellness across the state through numerous resources. From advocating at the state and federal levels to investing in critical research aimed at cures, our agencies provide direct support to Nebraskans.



Advocacy

All member agency staff and volunteers advocate for their cause on state and national levels.



Programming and Education

All agencies excel at providing programming and educational outreach. Virtual outreach ensures all Nebraskans can access the resources they need.



Support Networks

23 agencies offer robust support networks in Nebraska, including hybrid platforms to connect those who are homebound.



Patient and Family Assistance

19 agencies offer financial assistance programs to patients and their families to offset medical costs.



Camps and Family Events

9 agencies host children and families at camp events to empower, build a sense of community and enable lifelong learning and friendships.



Vital Research

18 agencies fund, participate in and secure better screenings, treatments, prevention and outcomes to reach a goal of cure.

Advocacy

American Foundation for Suicide Prevention Nebraska focuses on advancing public policies that will save lives at the federal and local levels. It was part of the effort to establish the nationwide 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline.

Brain Injury Alliance of Nebraska advocates for the brain injury community at the state government level by following legislative proceedings and speaking either for or against bills as they benefit individuals affected by brain injury.

Programming and Education

Over 200 people talked to an **American Lung Association in Nebraska** Lung HelpLine expert, including nurses, respiratory therapists and tobacco treatment specialists.

The **Nebraska Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation** served over 75 families through expanded programming to underserved populations.

Support Networks

Brain Injury Alliance of Nebraska's specialists have helped 1,000+ clients through support teams that offer resources and referral services.

80% of **Nebraska hospices** participated in the We Honor Veterans campaign. Nebraska Hospice-Veteran Partnership provided 430 pins for use in dying veterans' pinning ceremonies.

Patient and Family Assistance

The **Leukemia and Lymphoma Society – Nebraska Chapter** provided \$517,585 in co-pay and travel assistance to 263 Nebraska patients.

The **National MS Society, Mid-America Chapter's** Navigator Program provided assistance to 177 constituents in Nebraska, including \$80,072 in direct financial assistance.

Camps and Family Events

Over 40 patients and family members attended a Camp Oasis/My IBD event held by **Chron's & Colitis Foundation, Nebraska/Iowa Chapter**.

Heart Heroes, Inc. served over 500 families through family support events, in-patient support and Camp Brave Heart.

Vital Research

JDRF Nebraska-Iowa Chapter supported research for the recently approved TZield, which delays the onset of disease in at-risk individuals.

Team Jack Foundation pledged an additional \$5 million to the Childhood Brain Tumor Program at UNMC and Children's Hospital and Medical Center.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska supports CHAD through Health of Nebraska Sponsorship

For more than 80 years, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska (BCBSNE) has offered security and stability to its members faced with medical expenses. Through its Health of Nebraska initiative, BCBSNE seeks to support programs that address social determinants of health and health equity.

Thanks to BCBSNE's support, **9,811 Nebraskans (and counting!)** were directly impacted by this sponsorship over the last year. This annual funding helped to create or expand direct programming with **seven** member agencies. Additionally, **11** member agencies received support for their signature events across the state, raising over **\$1.4 million** for critical programming, resources and medical research. **Four** more agency recipients were awarded funding for their respective missions and general operating support.

BCBSNE's investment through the Health of Nebraska sponsorship continues to affect real change with patients, their families and communities across the state, all while supporting the missions of CHAD and the member health agencies.

Since 1939, **Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska** (BCBSNE) has called the great Cornhusker State home. Its members and employees have lived, worked and played here for more than 80 years.

Its employee engagement is second to none! Diversity, equity, inclusion, well-being and community involvement are hallmarks of the organization's culture. In the release of their 2022 Community Investment and Social Impact report, BCBSNE found the percentage of employees who believes the company values diversity and inclusion has increased steadily from 85% in 2020 to 93% in 2023.

For more than 30 years, BCBSNE has raised funds for United Way of the Midlands (with which CHAD has a contractual agreement), and its employees actively participate in their annual Day of Action and Day of Caring volunteer opportunities. Since 2020, in collaboration with YMCAs across the state, BCBSNE has held annual no-cost flu shot clinics, providing over 10,000 vaccinations to Nebraskans each year. They proudly support students and teachers across the state through grants for physical education departments, sponsorship of vision and hearing screenings, a partnership with the University of Nebraska, an annual school supply drive and more. These are just a few examples of BCBSNE's longstanding commitment to the health and well-being of all Nebraskans.
