





Our 22 member charities are working on behalf of all Nebraskans affected by chronic disease, disability and end-of-life issues.




























#### PARTNERSHIPS FOR HOPE

#### PARTNER IN HEALTH AWARDS PRESENTED

CHC-NE presented two Partner in Health awards at its 2016-2017 annual meeting at Champions Run. The recipients were **Union Bank & Trust**, Lincoln, and **Nebraska Public Power District** (NPPD), statewide. Presented each year, the award recognizes those who actively promote the ongoing awareness of health and wellness and also serves as a model of how individuals, commerce, government or industry and the health sector interact to improve the quality of life for those affected by chronic disease in local communities from all across the state.





Union Bank & Trust was recognized for its achievements in the United Way/CHC Campaign in Lincoln. Union Bank & Trust had the third largest campaign in 2016, raising \$472,036, with 92.8% going to the United Way Impact Fund. The company makes a generous corporate gift and matches employee's donations. The award also recognized employees who made a difference by volunteering. John Gessert has served on the CHC-NE Lincoln Board as the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation, Nebraska/Iowa Chapter Representative since 2008, and during this time, he served as Vice Chair and Chair. He also served on the United Way/CHC Campaign Cabinet. In addition, UBT employees Kim Keller, TJ Casady and Katie Thompson serve in leadership roles with Emerging Leaders United and Women United; Curt Rohn serves as the Marketing Chair on the United Way/CHC Campaign Cabinet; Doris Robertson serves as the Pacesetters Co-Chair on the Campaign Cabinet; and CEO Angie Muhleisen serves on the CHC-NE Lincoln Leadership Council.

Nebraska Public Power District was honored for the work it does to enhance the quality of life for all Nebraskans by serving people in 86 of Nebraska's 93 counties, either directly or through wholesale utilities partnerships. NPPD employees support community efforts by volunteering and financially supporting organizations that do good for everyone, such as CHC-NE. In 2016, NPPD raised \$31,383.20 for CHC-NE's health charities, and over the past four years, they've raised \$122,127.84. Patrick Pope, CEO, has consistently led by example and shown his support for the health of all Nebraskans as a GOLD Leadership donor, and many employees have also continued to give at this level for many years. All of the generous NPPD employees are greatly appreciated for their contributions and continue to be role models for others across the state.

#### UPDATE ON OUR 2013-2014 CAMPAIGN CHAIR

**Courtney Lierman** served as our 2013-2014 West Central Campaign Chair after being diagnosed with Chronic Myloid Leukemia (CML) in October 2012. It's been six years since she chaired the campaign, and in those six years, she graduated from high school and went on to complete her Bachelor's Degree in Advertising and Public Relations at the University of Nebraska-Kearney in four years. Now, she is back in Grand Island working as a Program and State Fair Volunteer Coordinator for the Grand Island Chamber of Commerce.

"The last six years have been anything but smooth, but I never once questioned putting my education or life on pause to let my disease take over. I still battle my Chronic Myelocytic Leukemia day in and day out, but I have learned to take it in stride," she said. "No one is guaranteed a life without illness. It truly can happen to anyone, but thanks to resources like Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, I'm not alone. I have support—mentally, physically, financially."



#### **SPOTLIGHT ON: TERESA LAYTON**

Teresa Layton, Great Western Bank, Wealth Management, has been involved with Community Health Charities of Nebraska for close to 18 years. She joined the Board as a representative for the Epilepsy Foundation of Nebraska, which is no longer a member charity, but she has remained active with CHC-NE, taking on the role of Board Chair beginning July 1, 2017. "Being on the Board for as many years as I have, I felt it was time to do more to serve CHC-NE," she said. "I have a lot of history with CHC-NE and felt that would be an advantage for me serving as Board Chair."

Teresa believes CHC-NE is important to the state and our local communities because helping families and individuals in our community live better and healthier lives is what CHC-NE is all about. "Knowing what our member charities do to improve lives and even save lives is what makes CHC-NE vital to our community," she said. SPOTLIGHT ON: JENNIFER KLEIN Jennifer Klein received the 2017 CHC-NE Speaker of the Year award. Jenn, a new speaker, shared her personal story nine times at Lincoln worksites. In 2015, Jenn found two large lumps during a self-exam and was diagnosed with an aggressively growing bilateral breast cancer. In total, Jenn did 20 weeks of chemotherapy, during which she had to have blood transfusions. She underwent a four-hour procedure that included a port removal, sentinel node biopsy, double mastectomy and immediate one-step reconstruction, followed by 33 sessions of radiation. By the end of 2015, Jenn was cancer free and now raises awareness and funds for CHC-NE and its charities.



SPOTLIGHT ON: RUSSELL SEBEK Russell Sebek, Wells Fargo, is the Lincoln Board Chair. He has served on the Campaign Cabinet since 2015 and in 2017, he chaired the United Way/ CHC Campaign and led efforts to raise \$6,748,450. Despite a tough campaign vear with many unexpected losses offsetting the large increases seen early on from the Pacesetters, Russ remained committed to the Campaign, leading the charge personally for the Wells Fargo campaign and working to increase overall funds on Giving Tuesday and through a Bridge the Gap effort. He went above and beyond to raise dollars this year, including riding a horse for kickoff and jumping into a cold lake in a He-Man costume.



## CURT GORDON MEMORIAL CHC-NE FOUNDATION

Five of Community Health Charities of Nebraska's 22 member charities received the 2018 grants from the Curt Gordon Memorial CHC-NE Foundation. These funds were awarded above and beyond the quarterly distributions that these charities are receiving from CHC-NE, which are provided by donors through the annual statewide campaign. The Foundation was established in 1997 as a response to the ever-increasing need for services from its member health charities. The Board of Directors is responsible for the Foundation's management, including oversight of the distribution of funds through a grant-making process. The Foundation Grant Committee awarded \$9,000 in grants to the following programs and charities:



On June 13, 2018, **Autism Action Partnership** held the first "Be Safe" Interactive Movie Screening where 50 officers from 10 different agencies were trained to recognize and respond to individuals with different types of disabilities. Thanks to the Curt Gordon Memorial CHC-NE Foundation grant, all participants received a DVD copy of "Be Safe" to take home. The project also built capacity in the community, as participants are prepared and empowered to continue making a difference in the community for years to come.



Arthritis Foundation Nebraska's Family Juvenile Arthritis Day is planned for Sept. 30, 2018, and will be held at Bellevue Berry Farm. JA Days are a great experience for children with juvenile arthritis (JA), their parents, caregivers and siblings. This program's greatest benefit to families is getting to meet and network with other families who are affected by JA and share some of the same feelings, experiences and concerns. It's a place to exchange ideas, give and receive encouragement, make new friends and know they are not alone.



Brain Injury Alliance of Nebraska's "Unmasking Brain Injury" project combines art, therapy and advocacy and gives individuals with brain injury the opportunity to share their story through the creation of a mask. The mask-making experience provides a vehicle for individuals with brain injury and their caregivers to tell their story via art therapy. So far, 35 masks have been made, and these will be displayed across the state to provide much-needed brain injury awareness throughout the communities the exhibit visits.



United Cerebral Palsy of Nebraska will be adding a new location of its Tech Tools Developmental Technology Library at Bryan Health West in Lincoln because of grant funds. The host site is encouraged to model therapeutic play to the children's families and encourage families to check out devices for use at home. This additional site increases the availability of these specialized devices within the Lincoln community and gives more children and families access to the Tech Tools Developmental Technology Libraries.



Every year, Muscular Dystrophy Association of Nebraska hosts a summer camp for children who are affected by a neuromuscular disease. The camp received a grant from the foundation this year to expand the barrier-free activities available to these campers, including adaptive archery, a full-time craft cabin and others. This year's camp was held from June 10 to June 15 at Camp Calvin Crest in Fremont, Neb.

There were 50 campers affected by a neuromuscular disease ranging from ages 8 to 17 who attended camp this year at no cost to their families, and two of the campers were brand new to camp. While the camp is physically located in Fremont, it draws in children from all over the state of Nebraska.

"The grant allowed us to facilitate barrier-free camp activities that foster both relationships and independence. It is important for our campers to learn to trust and rely on the care of those other than their parents," said Angie Connell, Executive Director of the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Nebraska. "Furthermore, it is crucial that we provide the summer camp option at no cost to the family, as it is a week of much-needed respite for our MDA parents."


