### Board of Directors/Leadership Council/Advisory Council\*

### **Expectations (include term, time, and monetary requirements):**

The Nebraska AFSP Chapter is eager to continue expanding our leadership base across the state. To be considered for the Board of Directors, we ask the following:

- Volunteers must serve on a committee for at least six months.
- If volunteer is a survivor of suicide loss, they must be at least two years after their loss.
- Attend at least one educational, advocacy, or survivor event or training.
- Participate in at least one fundraising event by contributing personal funds and soliciting donations from others.

Board members are elected annually and will serve a 3-year term. Board members are asked to attend all meetings\* of the Board of Directors, serve on at least one Chapter Committee, be knowledgeable about the issues of suicide and the mission and work of AFSP, among other requirements. We are proud to have active Board Members who truly lead the work of the NE AFSP Chapter and welcome diverse leadership from across the state! Your voice matters.
